Mind the gap in media CoveragE and Strategic communication in CasE of security Threats – the development of critical thinking and responsible reaction

Implementation period

October 1st, 2018 – August 31st, 2021

Tuesday, August 31st, 2021, marked the formal completion of the CRESCent project, following an initial implementation schedule of 24 months, extended by 11 months due to the COVID-19 pandemic. During this 35 month period, the project consortium worked tirelessly on developing a diverse set of learning and promoting activities dedicated to audiences interested in disinformation and security. Briefly speaking, during the project's last year, the following activities have taken place:

3rd Transnational Project Meeting (TPM3)

URJC organized the 3rd Transnational Project Meeting of the [CRESCent](#) project, on June 2-3, 2021. During the meeting, the consortium partners discussed the project's implementation, with reference to the activities pursued by each partner and the three Intellectual Outputs developed to date. Moreover, the consortium discussed and evaluated the results of the two multiplier events carried out in Spain and Romania, while finalizing arrangements for the 3rd multiplier event that was to be organized in Greece. Additionally, the partners analysed the results of the 1st and 2nd MOOC editions offered through the URJCx platform, and discussed the details of the 3rd edition, which became available on June 1st. Finally, a significant part of TPM3 was dedicated to the organization and implementation of the Virtual Learning Activities that, during June 2021, offered online training to learners from the three partner countries: Greece, Romania and Spain.

Multiplier events

Three [multiplier events](#) were organized by project partners, in order to increase the project's visibility and boost the dissemination of the project's intellectual outputs and online learning activities. In [Spain](#), the multiplier event took place on May 20th, organized by URJC, in a hybrid format of both onsite and online audience, with 38 attendees. In [Romania](#), the multiplier event took place on May 28th, jointly organized by MVNIA and MAI-DIRP, with 43 onsite attendees. Finally, in [Greece](#), the multiplier event took place virtually on June 11th, with 27 online participants. All three multiplier events were structured around the same format, roughly divided in two parts: the first part consisted of a brief, yet comprehensive, presentation of the project's outcomes and activities, while the second part consisted of a panel discussion with experts on key-topics addressed by the project.

MOOC – 3rd edition

The project's MOOC, titled [Strategic Communication to Counter Security Threats in the Disinformation Era](#) addresses the challenge of building awareness and developing resilience to disinformation, fake news, and hostile information influencing campaigns. It aims to increase the key knowledge and competences of institutional spokespersons and journalists (including young professionals in journalism and related disciplines/ areas) in the field of security and defense, and in relation to strategic communication and news reporting on security threats. The course has been developed by all consortium partners and it has been available through the URJCx platform for three editions: the 1st edition ran from June 1st to July 13th, 2020, with

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653 students enrolled and 312 certificates; the 2nd edition ran from November 3rd to December 14th, 2020, with 220 students enrolled and 70 certificates; and the 3rd edition ran from June 1st to July 13th, 2021, with 135 students.

Virtual Learning Activities (VLAs)

Throughout June 2021, project partners implemented a series of [Virtual Learning Activities](#) (VLAs), aiming to increase the key knowledge and competences of institutional spokespersons and journalists (including young professionals in journalism and related disciplines/ areas) in the field of security and defense and in relation to strategic communication and news reporting on security threats.

The VLAs took place through videoconference (Meet), based on a 5-day schedule structured as following: the first day consisted of intensive class sessions, delivered by specialised lecturers from partner institutions; the second day consisted of applied exercises in breakout sessions and Q&A, debates, wrap up and conclusions; finally, the third, fourth and fifth days offered spotlight events – keynote speaker sessions (recorded).

The VLAs were organised in three consecutive editions, 07-11 June, 14-18 June and 21-25 June 2021, with a total of 211 unique online learners.

4th Transnational Project Meeting (TPM4)

MAI-DIRP - Romania organized the 4th Transnational Project Meeting of the [CRESCent](#) project, on July 7-8, 2021. Having completed all the project's activities and deliverables, the consortium partners had the chance to reflect upon the projects overall development and to discuss the project's impact on the designated target groups. Additionally, the partners focus on numerous administrative matters, in view of the project's completion at the end of August 2021.
