Description of the Competition Procedure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - verification of the necessary conditions being met, by analyzing the application file and - oral exam which will consist of <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o a scientific presentation on a topic within the thematic area published in the competition file, chosen by the candidate and o a presentation of the candidate's proposal for university career development from the perspective of scientific research activities (attached to the application file).
Documents list	<p>The application file is composed, according to the Competition Regulation for vacant positions corresponding to research, development and innovation functions and professional ranks at the "Mihai Viteazul" National Intelligence Academy (Annex 5), of:</p> <p>a) the application form for the competition (Annex 10) signed by the candidate, which includes a declaration on one's own responsibility regarding the truthfulness of the information presented in the file;</p> <p>b) a proposal for the development of the candidate's university career from the perspective of scientific research activities; the proposal is prepared by the candidate, comprises a maximum of 5 pages and is one of the main criteria for distinguishing between candidates;</p> <p>c) curriculum vitae signed by the candidate (Europass model), according to Annex 5;</p> <p>d) list of works (Annex 11) of the candidate in printed and electronic format. In order for the competition committee to verify the truthfulness of the data presented by the candidates, for each work the electronic address confirming its ISI/BDI indexing will be indicated, respectively, the ISI/BDI citations;</p> <p>e) verification sheet of fulfillment of ANIMV standards for competition presentation (Annex 3). The verification sheet is completed and signed by the candidate. To support the score from the verification sheet of standards fulfillment, copies of the publication/book/paper/CD cover showing the ISBN or ISSN, as applicable, as well as a copy of the publication/book contents highlighting the article/chapter will be presented;</p> <p>f) copy of the bachelor's degree or equivalent/master's/doctoral degree, as applicable. In case the winning candidate does not hold a diploma issued by a higher education institution from Romania, they must submit a certified copy of the certificate of recognition or equivalence before employment and signing the individual employment contract, under the sanction of not issuing the administrative act of employment;</p> <p>g) declaration on the candidate's own responsibility indicating situations of incompatibility provided by the Higher Education Law no. 199/2023, with subsequent modifications and completions, which would occur in case of winning the competition or the absence of such incompatibility situations (Annex 12);</p> <p>h) declaration of assumption of responsibility by the candidate that the submitted file presents their own achievements and activities - for research positions (Annex 13);</p> <p>i) copies of other diplomas attesting the candidate's studies;</p> <p>j) copy of the identity card or, if the candidate does not have an identity card, of the passport or another identity document issued for a purpose equivalent to the identity card or passport;</p> <p>k) if the candidate has changed their name, copies of documents attesting to the</p>
